4 This Act may be cited as the "Hate Crime Reporting

7 Section 155 of the National Telecommunications and

8 Information Administration Organization Act (enacted as

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section 135 of Public Law 102–538; 106 Stat. 3542) is
amended to read as follows:

3 "SEC. 155. REPORT ON THE ROLE OF TELECOMMUNI4 CATIONS IN HATE CRIMES.

5 "(a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of the Hate Crime Reporting 6 7 Act of 2014, the NTIA, with the assistance of the Depart-8 ment of Justice, the Commission, and the United States 9 Commission on Civil Rights, shall submit a report to the 10 Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives and the 11 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation 12 13 and the Committee on the Judiciary of the Senate on the role of telecommunications in hate crimes in accordance 14 15 with subsection (b).

16 "(b) SCOPE OF REPORT.—The report required under17 subsection (a) shall—

18 "(1) analyze information on the use of tele-19 communications, including the Internet, broadcast 20 television and radio, cable television, public access 21 television, commercial mobile services, and other 22 electronic media, to advocate and encourage violent 23 acts and the commission of crimes of hate, as de-24 scribed in the Hate Crime Statistics Act (28 U.S.C. 25 534 note);

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((2)) include any recommendations, consistent 1 2 with the First Amendment to the Constitution of the 3 United States, that the NTIA determines are appro-4 priate and necessary to address the use of telecommunications described in paragraph (1); and 5 "(3) update the previous report submitted 6 under this section (as in effect before the date of en-7 8 actment of the Hate Crime Reporting Act of 9 2014).".
