Dear Secretary Perdue,

The *Coronavirus Aid*, *Relief*, *and Economic Security (CARES) Act* includes \$9.5 billion in support for agricultural producers affected by the coronavirus outbreak. We write to urge the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to include seafood companies, including on the East coast, among the recipients of this assistance. The pandemic-driven closure of restaurants and other businesses has devastated the New England seafood industry, as about two-thirds of seafood is consumed in restaurants and outside the home. Fishermen and processors that supply restaurants and local food systems need support.

The fishing and seafood industries are essential drivers of the New England economy. In 2018, nearly \$650 million of fisheries products landed in Massachusetts, and processing plants and wholesalers had almost 4,900 employees. With the loss of key customers, some processors in Massachusetts have already furloughed their staffs.

USDA is already well positioned to have *CARES Act* funding flow to the seafood industry. Historically, USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service Expenditures has purchased pollock and salmon through its the Section 32 program, which encourages domestic food consumption. Other USDA procurement programs could also readily include seafood products from New England. And although restaurants all across New England that serve seafood products are not currently open to diners, seafood processers are already organizing to turn restaurant product into ready-to-eat meals for Americans to enjoy at home during this crisis.

In order to help the fishing and seafood economy survive this crisis, we ask you to include the fishing industry and its participants in the financial support that the *CARES Act* provides for agricultural producers. We stand ready to help facilitate your engagement with the fishing and seafood community however we can.
