A BILL

To restrict the first-use strike of nuclear weapons.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Restricting First Use
- 5 of Nuclear Weapons Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION OF POLICY.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The Constitution gives Congress the sole
- 9 power to declare war.
- 10 (2) The framers of the Constitution understood
- that the monumental decision to go to war, which
- can result in massive death and the destruction of

civilized society, must be made by the representatives of the people and not by a single person.

- (3) As stated by section 2(c) of the War Powers Resolution (Public Law 93–148; 50 U.S.C. 1541), "the constitutional powers of the President as Commander-in-Chief to introduce United States Armed Forces into hostilities, or into situations where imminent involvement in hostilities is clearly indicated by the circumstances, are exercised only pursuant to (1) a declaration of war, (2) specific statutory authorization, or (3) a national emergency created by attack upon the United States, its territories or possessions, or its armed forces".
- (4) Nuclear weapons are uniquely powerful weapons that have the capability to instantly kill millions of people, create long-term health and environmental consequences throughout the world, directly undermine global peace, and put the United States at existential risk from retaliatory nuclear strikes.
- (5) A first-use nuclear strike carried out by the United States would constitute a major act of war.
- (6) A first-use nuclear strike conducted absent a declaration of war by Congress would violate the Constitution.

1 (7) The President has the sole authority to au-2 thorize the use of nuclear weapons, an order which 3 military officers of the United States must carry out 4 in accordance with their obligations under the Uni-5 form Code of Military Justice. 6 (8) Given its exclusive power under the Con-7 stitution to declare war, Congress must provide 8 meaningful checks and balances to the President's 9 sole authority to authorize the use of a nuclear 10 weapon. 11 (b) Declaration of Policy.—It is the policy of the 12 United States that no first-use nuclear strike should be 13 conducted absent a declaration of war by Congress. 14 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON CONDUCT OF FIRST-USE NU-15 CLEAR STRIKES. 16 (a) Prohibition.—No Federal funds may be obli-17 gated or expended to conduct a first-use nuclear strike unless such strike is conducted pursuant to a war declared 18 19 by Congress that expressly authorizes such strike. 20 (b) First-Use Nuclear Strike Defined.—In this 21 section, the term "first-use nuclear strike" means an at-22 tack using nuclear weapons against an enemy that is con-23 ducted without the Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff first confirming to the President that there has been a nuclear strike against the

1 United States, its territories, or its allies (as specified in

- 2 section 3(b)(2) of the Arms Export Control Act (22 U.S.C.
- 3 2753(b)(2))).
