## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Transportation to issue a final rule revising motor vehicle seat back safety standards.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Modernizing Seat Back

5 Safety Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. MOTOR VEHICLE SEAT BACK SAFETY STANDARDS.

- 7 (a) FINDINGS; PURPOSES.—
- 8 (1) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
- 9 (A) crashes involving seat structural fail-
- 10 ures in passenger motor vehicles pose a signifi-

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1	cant public health and safety threat, particu-
2	larly to children occupying rear seats;
3	(B) thousands of preventable fatalities and
4	life-threatening injuries have occurred as a re-
5	sult of motor vehicle seat failures;
6	(C) the National Highway Traffic Safety
7	Administration has neglected to improve the
8	motor vehicle seat integrity standard for more
9	than 50 years, to the detriment of passenger
10	motor vehicle safety; and
11	(D) this Act is introduced in honor and
12	memory of the victims of motor vehicle seat
13	failures in crashes, including those whose pre-
14	cious lives were cut far too short as a result of
15	seat failures and those whose catastrophic inju-
16	ries dramatically changed their lives, including
17	Taylor Grace Warner, Jayden-Faith Fraser,
18	Emily Reavis, Owen Reavis, Teddy Schwab,
19	Jaklin Romine, Russell Selkirk, Travis
20	Oldhouser, Thomas Comella, Geneva Massie,

24	(2) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act
25	are—

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(A) to reduce the number of preventable
 deaths and injuries caused by motor vehicle
 seat failures; and

4 (B) to improve passenger motor vehicle5 safety.

6 (b) FINAL RULE.—Not later than 2 years after the 7 date of enactment of this Act, subject to subsection (c), 8 the Secretary of Transportation shall issue a final rule up-9 dating section 571.207 of title 49, Code of Federal Regu-10 lations, to reduce the potential for injury to all motor vehi-11 cle occupants due to seat back failure during all types of 12 vehicle impact.

(c) COMPLIANCE DATE.—In issuing the final rule
pursuant to subsection (b), the Secretary of Transportation shall establish a date for required compliance with
the final rule of not later than 2 motor vehicle model years
after the model year during which the effective date of
the final rule occurs.
