3 SECT	ION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Gay and Trans Panic
5 Defer	nse Prohibition Act of 2018".
6 SEC. 2	2. FINDINGS.
7	Congress finds that—
8	(1) the American Bar Association has urged the

Federal Government to take legislative action to cur-

tail the availability and effectiveness of the "gay

panic" and "trans panic" defenses, which seek to 1 2 partially or completely excuse crimes such as murder 3 and assault on the grounds that the sexual orientation or gender identity of the victim is provocation 4 5 enough for the violent reaction of the defendant; 6 (2) gay and trans panic legal defenses, which 7 continue to be raised in criminal proceedings in Fed-8 eral courts across the United States, are surprisingly 9 long-lived historical artifacts, remnants of a time 10 when widespread public antipathy was the norm for 11 lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (referred to 12 in this Act as "LGBT") individuals; 13 (3) gay and trans panic defenses characterize 14 sexual orientation and gender identity as objectively 15 reasonable excuses for loss of self-control, and there-16 by illegitimately mitigate the responsibility of a per-17 petrator for harm done to LGBT individuals; 18 (4) gay and trans panic defenses appeal to irra-19 tional fears and hatred of LGBT individuals, there-20 by undermining the legitimacy of Federal criminal 21 prosecutions and resulting in unjustifiable acquittals 22 or sentencing reductions; 23 (5) the use of gay and trans panic defenses is 24 entirely incompatible with the express intent of Fed-25 eral law to provide increased protection to victims of

1 bias-motivated crimes, including crimes committed 2 against LGBT individuals; (6) continued use of these anachronistic de-3 fenses reinforces and institutionalizes prejudice at 4 5 the expense of norms of self-control, tolerance, and 6 compassion, which the law should encourage, and 7 marks an egregious lapse in the march of the United 8 States toward a more just criminal justice system; 9 and 10 (7) to end the antiquated notion that LGBT 11 lives are worth less than others and to reflect mod-12 ern understanding of LGBT individuals as equal 13 citizens under law, gay and trans panic defenses 14 must end. 15 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON GAY AND TRANS PANIC DE-16 FENSES. 17 (a) In General.—Chapter 1 of title 18, United 18 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-19 lowing: 20 "§ 28. Prohibition on gay and trans panic defenses 21 "(a) Prohibition.—No nonviolent sexual advance or 22 perception or belief, even if inaccurate, of the gender, gen-23 der identity or expression, or sexual orientation of an individual may be used to excuse or justify the conduct of an individual or mitigate the severity of an offense.

- 1 "(b) Past Trauma.—Notwithstanding the prohibi-
- 2 tion in subsection (a), a court may admit evidence, in ac-
- 3 cordance with the Federal Rules of Evidence, of prior
- 4 trauma to the defendant for the purpose of excusing or
- 5 justifying the conduct of the defendant or mitigating the
- 6 severity of an offense.".
- 7 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—
- 8 The table of sections for chapter 1 of title 18, United
- 9 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 10 lowing:

"28. Prohibition on gay and trans panic defenses.".

- 11 (c) Report.—The Attorney General shall submit to
- 12 Congress an annual report that details prosecutions in
- 13 Federal court involving capital and noncapital crimes com-
- 14 mitted against LGBT individuals that were motivated by
- 15 the victim's gender, gender identity or expression, or sex-
- 16 ual orientation.
