SITUATIONS LIKE TIMES BEACH, MISSOURI AND LOVE
CANAL ARE NOT UNIQUE. THERE ARE UNKNOWN NUMBERS OF
VICTIMS THAT COULD BE HELPED BY THIS BILL. IN MY
DISTRICT, IN WOBURN, MASS., FAMILIES HAVE EXPERIENCED
AN ABNORMALLY HIGH INCIDENCE OF LEUKEMIA AND OTHER HEALTH
PROBLEMS, WHICH MANY SUSPECT ARE RELATED TO A HAZARDOUS
WASTE SITE THERE.

THIS LEGISLATION IS MODELED -- WITH SOME CHANGES -- AFTER A PROPOSAL RESULTING FROM A THOROUGH STUDY OF VICTIM COMPENSATION MANDATED IN THE 1980 SUPERFUND LAW.

WE HAVE BEEN CAREFUL TO AVOID OPENING THE FLOODGATES

TO ILLEGITIMATE CLAIMS. A PERSON MUST PROVE THAT EXPOSURE

TO A HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE CAUSED OR SIGNIFICANTLY CONTRIBUTED

TO HIS ILLNESS. ALSO, THERE IS PROTECTION FOR THE DEFENDANTS

IN THAT THEY CAN BRING SEPARATE ACTIONS AGAINST OTHER

RESPONSIBLE PARTIES TO RECOVER DAMAGES PAID OUT. AT THE

SAME TIME, WE HAVE EASED THE STRICT RULES THAT HAVE

PREVENTED VICTIMS FROM RECOVERING IN COURT UNDER EXISTING

LAWS.

THIS BILL WILL GIVE VICTIMS OF THE LONG-IRRESPONSIBLE HANDLING OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES SOMEWHERE TO TURN. I AM CONFIDENT MY COLLEAGUES IN THE HOUSE WILL SUPPORT THIS MUCH-NEEDED LEGISLATION.
