AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Mr. MARKEY to the amendment (No. 3867) proposed by Mr. REED

Viz:

1 At the end of subtitle G of title XII, add the fol-  
2 lowing:

3 **SEC. 1283. GLOBAL CLIMATE ASSISTANCE FUNDS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amount authorized to be ap-  
5 propriated for fiscal year 2022 by this Act is the aggregate  
6 amount authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2022  
7 by this Act minus one percent.

8 (b) ALLOCATION.—The allocation of the reduction  
9 under subsection (a) shall be derived from the additional  
10 \$25,026,879,000 provided by the House of Representa-

1 tives to the discretionary authorizations within the juris-  
2 diction of the Committee on Armed Services of the House  
3 of Representatives, as set forth on page 350 of the report  
4 of the Committee on Armed Services of the House of Rep-  
5 resentatives accompanying H.R. 4350 of the 117th Con-  
6 gress (H. Rept. 117–118).

7 (c) USE OF FUNDS.—Amounts from the reduction  
8 under subsection (a) shall be used by the Secretary of  
9 State, in coordination with the Administrator of the  
10 United States Agency for International Development and  
11 the Secretary of the Treasury, as appropriate, to increase  
12 the authorization of appropriations for funds to global cli-  
13 mate assistance accounts, programs, organizations, and  
14 international financial institutions described in subsection  
15 (d) for the following purposes:

16 (1) To reduce the risks to United States na-  
17 tional security due to climate change, as set forth in  
18 the national intelligence estimate of the National In-  
19 telligence Council entitled “Climate Change and  
20 International Responses Increasing Challenges to  
21 US National Security Through 2040” (NIC-NIE-  
22 2021-10030-A).

23 (2) To provide public climate financing to devel-  
24 oping countries, with the objective of limiting the in-

1           crease in global temperature at or below 1.5 degrees  
2           Celsius above pre-industrial levels.

3           (d) GLOBAL CLIMATE ASSISTANCE ACCOUNTS, PRO-  
4 GRAMS, ORGANIZATIONS, AND INTERNATIONAL FINAN-  
5 CIAL INSTITUTIONS DESCRIBED.—The global climate as-  
6 sistance accounts, programs, organizations, and inter-  
7 national financial institutions described in this subsection  
8 are the following:

- 9           (1) The Green Climate Fund.
- 10           (2) Global Environment Facility.
- 11           (3) Adaptation Programs.
- 12           (4) Sustainable Landscapes.
- 13           (5) Clean Energy Programs.
- 14           (6) Biodiversity Programs.
- 15           (7) The Clean Technology Fund.
- 16           (8) Migration and Refugee Assistance.
- 17           (9) International Disaster Assistance.
- 18           (10) Montreal Protocol Multilateral Fund  
19           (MLF).
- 20           (11) The United Nations Framework Conven-  
21           tion on Climate Change.
- 22           (12) The Adaptation Fund.
