- 5 one Act of 2021" or the "SAFE Act of 2021".

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1SEC. 2. RESEARCH REGARDING REDUCTION OR ELIMI-2NATION OF DRIVER DISTRACTION.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the
4 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor5 tation shall conduct research regarding the installation
6 and use on motor vehicles of driver monitoring systems
7 to minimize or eliminate—

8 (1) driver distraction;

9 (2) driver disengagement;

10 (3) automation complacency by drivers; and

11 (4) foreseeable misuse of advanced driver-assist12 systems.

(b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
of completion of the research under subsection (a), the
Secretary of Transportation shall submit to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the
Senate and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of
the House of Representatives a detailed report describing
the findings of the research.

20 (c) RULEMAKING.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 4 years after
the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
Transportation shall issue a final rule to establish
performance standards for driver monitoring systems and require those systems to be installed on all

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1	new passenger motor vehicles, subject to paragraphs
2	(2) and (3).
3	(2) COMPLIANCE DATE.—The compliance date
4	of the performance standards and installation re-
5	quirement prescribed under paragraph (1) shall be
6	not later than 2 motor vehicle model years after the
7	effective date of the final rule issued under that
8	paragraph.
9	(3) PRIVACY.—The rule issued under para-
10	graph (1) shall incorporate appropriate privacy and
11	data security safeguards, as determined by the Sec-
12	retary of Transportation.
